Deadlines:

- When applying for the first application period of the call for enrolment for available places for the citizens of the Republic of Slovenia and the EU, the application must be submitted no later than **31th August 2023**.
- When applying for the available places for foreigners and Slovenians without Slovenian citizenship, the application must be submitted no later than **4th July 2023**.
- When applying for the second application period of the call for enrolment (if available places are not filled in the first application period), the application must be submitted no later than **20th September 2023**.
- On programmes on which there will be more candidates than there are places available, enrolment will be limited. The selection of candidates will be made after the completion of the autumn exam term, that is on **16th September 2023**. The registered candidates must fulfill the admission requirements until **15th September 2023**.

Transfer between Study Programmes

A transfer between study programmes is valid for all second-cycle study programmes (single-subject, dual-subject) at the Faculty of Arts.

A transfer is possible between programmes of the same study cycle, i.e. between second-cycle programmes.

Transfers are possible between study programmes

- that offer comparable competencies upon graduating, and
- that allow for the transfer of at least of half of the credits from the first study programme to the new programme, according to the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (hereinafter ECTS).

The student may enrol in a higher study year of another programme under the condition that the required amount of those credit points necessary to proceed to a higher year of the state-approved study programme are recognised during the transfer process.

(*There is an additional condition for the second-cycle Master's study programme in Interpreting: the student must pass a test of interpreting abilities.)

Enrolment in the first year of a study programme does not count as a transfer between programmes.

The following may be recognised during the transfer process:

- comparable study obligations that the student has completed during his or her first year, and
- informally acquired knowledge.

Any knowledge the student might have obtained in advance must be substantiated by submitting relevant documentation.

In compliance with the conditions required for a transfer, the recognition of study commitments are examined and decided on by the competent body of the faculty on the basis of the candidate's individual application and the proposal of the department, following the procedure set out in the Statute of the University of Ljubljana.

If the student has completed study obligations at a foreign higher education institution, he or she must apply for recognition of a foreign education by submitting the appropriate form according to the Recognition and Evaluation of Education Act. The application must include all necessary documents.

I. Second-Cycle Master's Study Programme: Andragogy – Teacher Education

Study courses:

- Andragogy – Single Teacher Education Course
- Andragogy – Combined Teacher Education Course

Duration: 2 years

Admission Requirements:

A prospective student is eligible to apply for admission under any of the following conditions:

- a) she or he has completed a first cycle study programme worth at least 180 ECTS or higher from the same or similar field (Pedagogy and Andragogy and other similar study programmes from the field of Educational Sciences, Psychology, Social Pedagogy, Sociology – Human Resources Management, or Social Work) or an equivalent study programme in line with current regulations in Slovenia or abroad;

- b) she or he has completed a first cycle study programme worth at least 180 ECTS or higher from another field or an equivalent study programme in line with current regulations in Slovenia or abroad, under the condition that the candidate has completed those study obligations required for the continuation of study prior to enrolment. These obligations are determined by the department carrying out the study programme or course and are comprised of 10 to a maximum of 60 ECTS for a single study programme or course and 10 to a maximum of 60 ECTS together for both combined study programmes or courses.

The candidate may complete the required obligations during first-cycle study, as part of a training programme, or by taking the differential exams prior to enrolment in second-cycle study programme.

Each application is considered individually. The extent and content of additional study obligations from core subjects required for second-cycle study are also determined individually for each applicant.

Selection Criteria and Procedure in the Case of Limited Enrolment:

In the case of limited enrolment, candidates will be selected according to the average grade in all courses of the first-cycle study programme.

All candidates must demonstrate knowledge of Slovene at level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) with an appropriate certificate. Proper evidence of compliance with the conditions for enrollment are:

- A certificate of passing the examination of Slovene at the B2 level or equivalent certificate,

- Certificate of completed primary school in Slovenia or completed foreign primary school with Slovene as teaching language,
- High school diploma or certificate from last year of secondary professional education which contained subject Slovene,

Duration: 2 years

Admission Requirements:

A prospective student is eligible to apply for admission under any of the following conditions:

- a) she or he has completed a first-cycle programme in one of the following fields: Polish Studies, Slovak Studies, Czech Studies, or West Slavic Studies;
- b) she or he has completed a first-cycle programme in another field, under the condition that the candidate has completed those study obligations required for the continuation of study at the second-cycle prior to enrolment. These obligations are determined according to the field of the candidate's previously completed education and require the candidate to obtain 10-60 ECTS.
- c) she or he has completed a professional higher education programme implemented before June 11, 2004 in a relevant field (Polish Studies, Slovak Studies, Bohemistics, or West Slavic Studies), under the condition that the candidate has completed those study obligations required for the continuation of study at the second-cycle prior to enrolment. These obligations are determined according to the field of the candidate's previously completed education and require the candidate to obtain anywhere from 10 to 60 ECTS;
- d) she or he has completed a professional higher education programme implemented before June 11, 2004 in another field, under the condition that the candidate has completed those study obligations required for the continuation of study at the second-cycle prior to enrolment. These obligations are determined according to the field of the candidate's previously completed education and require the candidate to obtain up to a maximum of 60 ECTS.

The candidate may complete the required obligations during first-cycle study, as part of a training programme, or by taking the differential exams prior to enrolment in second-cycle study.

Each application is considered individually. The extent and content of additional study obligations in core subjects required for second-cycle study are also determined individually for each candidate.

In accordance with Article 91 of the Statute of the University of Ljubljana, the programme's admission requirements are also satisfied by those candidates who have successfully completed an equivalent education abroad. The procedure is managed by an authorised person at the University of Ljubljana. The decision on the recognition of a foreign education is made by the Dean of the member institution of the University of Ljubljana, in accordance with Article 70 of the Statute of the University of Ljubljana.

Selection Criteria and Procedure in the Case of Limited Enrolment:

In the case of limited enrolment, candidates will be selected according to the following criteria:

- the average grade achieved during first-cycle or undergraduate study (70%), and
- the final thesis/final exam grade (30%).
