

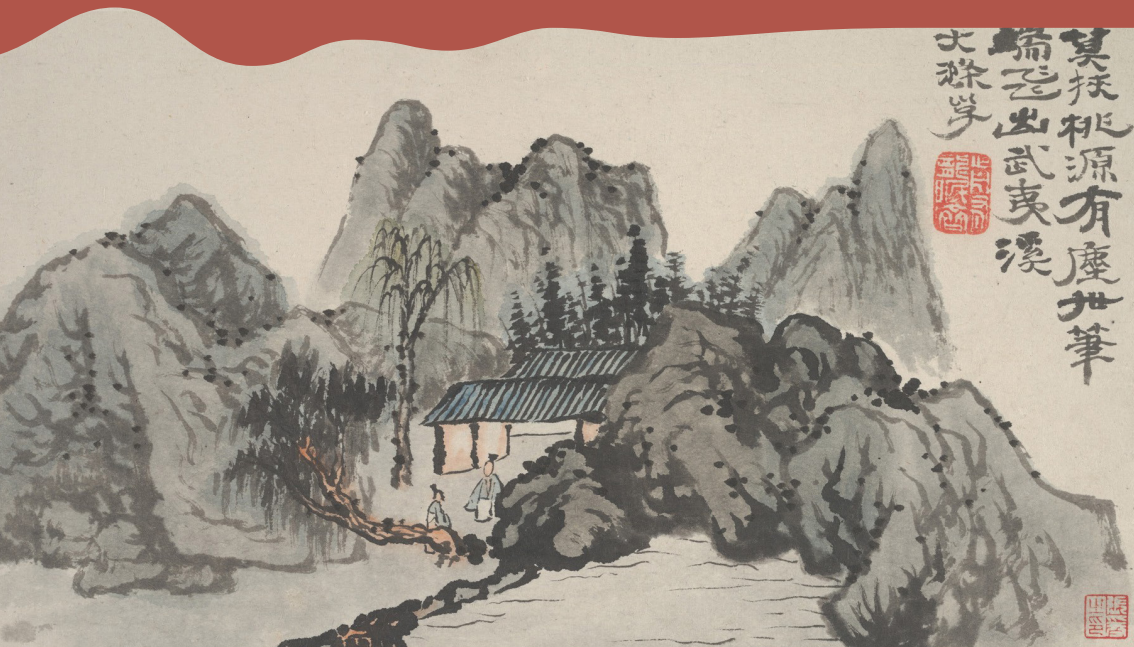

Dear Participants of the 24th Conference of the International Society for Chinese Philosophy,

let me provide you with some important logistical details to ensure your experience over the next four days is seamless and enjoyable.

Opening Ceremony and Plenary Sessions

The conference opens with a ceremony, followed by a short coffee and tea break in the faculty aula.

All three keynote speeches, scheduled for the morning sessions on June 20 and June 21, will be held in Lecture Hall 15. To ensure all attendees can participate, a simultaneous transmission will be provided in Lecture Hall 2, located directly opposite Hall 15. Please note that attendees in Hall 2 will not be able to rise questions in the Q&A sessions. Choose your seating wisely!

Parallel Panels and Author Meets Readers Sessions

In addition to the plenary sessions and keynote speeches, the majority of sessions will feature five parallel panels, held in Lecture Halls 2, 4, 13, and 15, all conveniently located on the ground floor in the same wing of the faculty. The Author Meets Readers sessions will take place in the Blue Room on the 5th floor. Elevators are available on both sides of the aula for your convenience.

Registration Desk and Refreshments

The registration desk, located in the aula where you collected your conference materials, will remain open throughout the first two days of the conference. All coffee and tea breaks will also take place in the aula. All

registered participants are invited to enjoy two breaks daily: one in the morning and one in the afternoon.

Lunch Arrangements

Warm lunches will be served on the 1st floor, just one level above us. Elevators are accessible for those who prefer not to use the stairs. If you're seeking a quiet space during lunch, several empty lecture halls on the 1st floor will be open for your use. As lunch breaks will generally be fairly long, you might also choose to take a short walk after your meal. There is a small park (Foerster's Park) just behind the faculty building, and the old town is only a five-minute walk away—ideal for a brief stroll to stretch your legs and help digest your meal.

Welcome Reception and Closing Dinner

If you registered for the welcome reception (taking place on June 20, at 7:30 PM) or the closing dinner (taking place on June 23, at 7 PM), you should have received entrance coupons together with your name tags and conference bag. Please keep these safe, as they serve as your tickets for these events. Both events are free but limited to registered guests. For those heading there directly from the faculty, we'll meet in the aula:

- **Welcome Reception:** Friday at 7:00 PM
- **Closing Dinner:** Monday at 6:30 PM

Our students will guide you to the venues. Venue details are also available on our website and in this conference booklet, for those of you who would prefer to walk there by yourselves.

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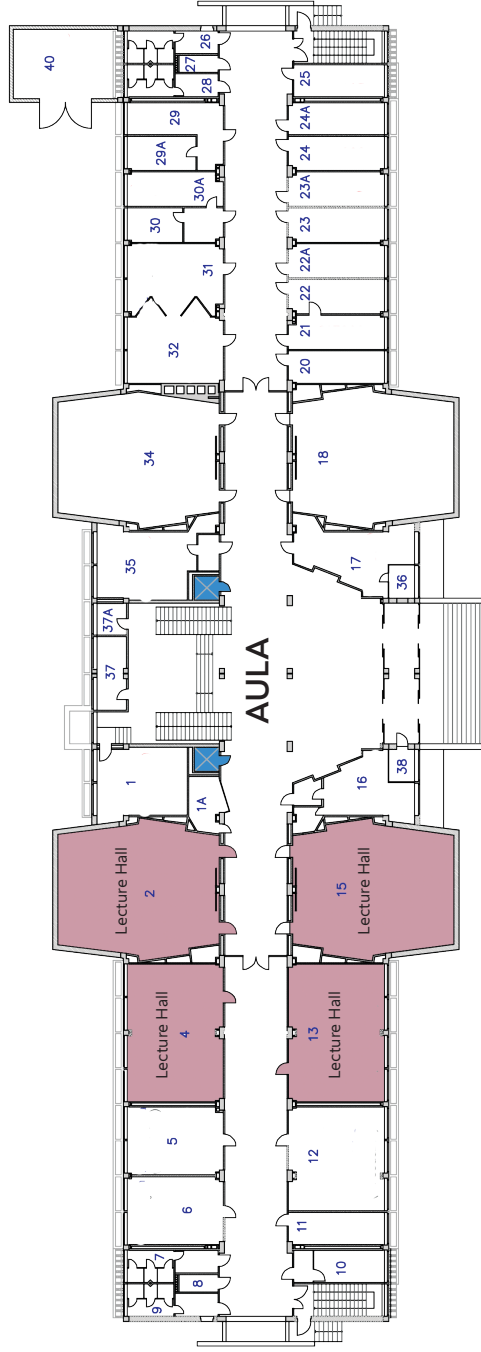
